September 2018 — HSA CHINA is born. HSA Course Director Mark Rausch traveled to Shenzhen City, China to train and certify 16 new Handicapped Scuba Association (HSA) Instructors.

MINGXUN ZHANG, nick name Panda, is the business manager for ZL Dive, a dive training & travel company based in Shenzhen City, with locations in Malaysia and the Philippines. For several months Mark communicated with Panda and answered her many questions about training and diving for people with disabilities. It took months to decide, but once the Chinese dive instructors got behind the HSA Instructor Training Course (ITC) there was no holding back!



The lectures were conducted at the ZL Dive store, and the confined water sessions were conducted at a pool located in Luohu Commercial City, a famous large multi-story shopping mall. So, the scuba equipment was carried from ZL Dive, down the street, through the mall and up to the pool in elevators. After which 5 hours of confined water training exercises took place, with their legs tied simulating paraplegic & quadriplegic students, and blacked out masks to simulate blind students. Then of course there was the trek back to ZL Dive, that's dedication!

The open water training was equally daunting. The ITC candidates suited up all gear at the ZL Dive store and walked down the street,

with ITC candidates taking turns carrying each other, out onto the pier, where they boarded small boats! After completing the open water training in the bay, they disembarked and walked with all their gear back to the dive shop.
